

Day Camp Program

Camp Hours and Fees: A one-time \$10 processing fee is charged, part of which pays for your child's camp shirt. A \$20 down payment per week is due when you register to be applied toward the weekly fee. The balance is due Monday of the week that your child is attending. Units with activity fees are noted. **Please review registration packet cover for camp hours for your camp location.**

Before and After Camp Care: Before and after camp care is available independently from the registration of the summer camp day and can be used to surround your child's summer school enrollment or camp day. Please review registration packet cover for before and after camp care hours for your camp location.

Staff: All camp staff are eighteen years or older, are caring, energetic and have experience and education related to working with school-age children. A site staff team may be made up of the camp director, an assistant director, specialists and counselors.

Kick-Off: Monday the staff welcome campers, review rules, explain routines and schedules, and familiarize new campers with camp. Kick-off concludes with a fun activity sure to help everyone get comfortable with one another and excited about their week.

Special Events: Special events for the whole camp are theme-related activities best suited for a larger group. They might include games, activity stations or special guests and presentations. Special events are a great opportunity for social interaction beyond the established small groups.

Snack and Lunch: Morning and afternoon snacks are served daily. Campers bring their own lunch and beverage to camp. Lunches should be packed so as not to require refrigeration or microwaving. Milk and juice are served daily and available at lunchtime when campers are on location. Parents are responsible for supplying a beverage when kids are off site at lunchtime.

Field Trips: Each group of campers in the Tigers and Eagles groups will take field trips to fun, educational destinations related to their unit or theme. Field trips are taken via chartered school bus, AFTER SCHOOL van or bus with an approved driver. Notice of all field trips are posted the Friday prior to the start of the week. **All campers must wear a camp shirt on all field trips.**

Swim Trips: Campers will visit an area public beach or swimming pool each week, weather permitting. Campers swim only at beaches and pools where lifeguards are present and only in areas designated as safe by the city and county health departments. Swimming and playing at the beach is a highlight for campers and is a long-time tradition at AFTER SCHOOL Summer Day Camp. Camp Cub participants do not take swimming field trips but do have plenty of water fun to help cool off on hot days!



NEW! CAMP TNT

Camp TNT is a special program designed to appeal to youth entering fifth through eighth grade who want to move beyond traditional summer day camp and explore interests and challenge themselves. TNT campers will help determine their activities which will be based on the weekly themes. There will be opportunities to develop leadership skills by helping with all camp activities and mentoring younger campers. They can also pursue hobbies, build friendships and perform community service as well as develop skills in special interest areas. Camp TNT is for teens on the move! Campers will take field trips to fun destinations by bus, van or on foot, learning about themselves as they explore their community.
